1. a) To protect the rights of creators of original works
2. a) Criminal and civil penalties, including fines and imprisonment

5. c) Patent. The language in the question comes directly from the Act. **Inventions are protected by patents.**

9. A **patent** safeguards intellectual property by granting exclusive rights to an inventor preventing others from using, making, or selling the invention without permission.
